VILLAGE HALL Meeting 16 October 2023:

14 villagers attended,7 others sent apologies.Thank you to all.

The full minutes are available electronically,

however in summary:

The meeting opened with a talk by Tracy Stewart, chair of South Luffenham Village Hall on how she and a small dedicated team, together with grants and fund raising events, turned their old village hall from an unloved & unused, dilapidated old building into a vibrant hall, now in regular use and generating money for local needs and other worthwhile charities. Despite differences in our situations, the talk gave us heart to continue our own revival of our village hall to enable us provide а valuable amenity to those who may need it now and in the future.

The Village Hall section on the Glaston Website now includes background history of the VH, a booking page with fees, availability, booking form and events. Thank you to Richard Garton for all his help.

Maintenance: Firstly thank you to Andrew Bussey for providing a fantastic report, this gives us a great starting point. Following the Gateley Smithers Purslow survey the village questionnaire results, work has begun to tidy and clear the outside area for general aesthetics and in preparation of essential repairs to the guttering, start date mid November. Internally the kitchen has been deep cleaned, the store room is next!

Treasurers Report: the Village Hall is not a profit making organisation so the aim is to keep the current account to a working minimum and to have a savings account emergency funds. It was agreed that £2,000 of the emergency funds should be used for the essential maintenance repairs. There seems to be the perception that the village hall is a money pit however thanks to Di Morgan's long-term experience of keeping control of money matters, the village hall continues to finance itself whilst also contributing to the church funds and other charities.

Chairman's Report: Jo will approach various bodies to enquire about funding for improvements, etc. and also approach the PCC to see when the new Terms of Reference will be signed off. Past events: The September Swish was a new 'thing' to many of us. Some of the few that came were ladies from out of the village who saw advertisement the Facebook. We had quite a laugh so by popular demand it is back for December! The September jumble and cake sale was

cake sale was well supported by donators and bakers, unfortunately not particularly well supported by purchasers. All those fresh delicious homemade cakes ...

However, we did raise just under £300 and the left over items of jumble were donated/collected by the Air Ambulance. 55 people mainly from out of Glaston attended a Spanish Evening at the village hall in September. The hall was decorated beautifully and hot & cold tapas served was delicious. Parking was mostly along Seaton Road so there was no disruption to residents on Church Lane. The committee are very conscious not to exacerbate the Church Lane parking issues.

Planned events: as well as those mentioned, see diary dates, we still hope to hold a summer fete for 2024. 'Glaston-Berries' perhaps? A co-ordinator and volunteers required for early planning.

The committee are very happy to report that Di has agreed to remain treasurer. We are however looking for a new secretary, Vicki Laskey is resigning but has kindly agreed continue until replacement can be found. We are also looking for a new committee member. Paul Colliss has sadly retired due to his health. We sincerely thank Paul for his committee work over the vears.

BONUS BALL

The Bonus Ball scheme is the only source of income for the Community Fund, established in 2004 to raise monies for local projects suggested by villagers and not covered by the Council. 35 numbers out of 59 possible numbers allocated raising £1,820 per year. If all 59 numbers were allocated, £3,068 would be raised, £20 would be won each week totalling £1,040, leaving £2,028 available in the Fund. Contributions have supported events such as the Coronation Street Party, it paid for the first year's provision of internet facilities in the village hall and the main routine expenditure is committed to the maintenance of the play park.

The Fund is managed by Stephanie Talbot, Suzie Colliss and Polly Grimmett. A huge thank you to Steph & Hugh Talbot who run the The Community scheme. Fund is moving towards becoming a charity giving it firm legal footing. Requests and ideas for the use of the funding can be presented and discussed at the Parish Meeting.
