The Wreath making at the end of November was verv successful and with generous support from Jo Beaver and hard work by the VHMC over £900 was raised which is being shared between The Salvation Army Christmas appeal and to buy turf for the VH garden in the spring. We have regular weekly bookings with the Purestretch, Wednesday Raft and Irish dancing. All in all, money and time spent on improving the facilities has resulted in more people being able to enjoy the space with regular events and bookings.

We still have a job list and with the support received

from the village, we are happy and keen to continue. So, a huge thank you for your support.

Over the next couple of months we hope to level the remaining ground and erect fencing. Once the boundary is complete, we can look to weed kill the soil ready to lay turf in the spring. We are very excited to see how the outdoor area develops by next summer.

The Parish meeting took place on the 21st November. A full set of minutes have been emailed and can also be found on the Village website. Subjects covered included the following;

Playpark: Funding is now available from FCC (the grant giving body) and it is planned to install the new equipment in the spring to allow for a formal opening over the Easter weekend.

Village Notice Board: The notice board located on Church Lane at the drive way to the village hall, will be repaired/replaced in the near future.

News from Rutland Council:

The Chairman gave an update of the meeting he had attended which included information from both the Police and Crime Commissioner and the CEO of Rutland Council. Details can be found in the minutes. Traffic Calming on the A47: The Chairman reported that a discussion with Cllr Wise at Rutland Council resulted in a commitment by Highways dept. to undertake a review of the feasibility of a 'step-down' 40 mph speed limit and 'gates' at the side of the road at both ends of the village.

Updates from the Parochial Church Council and the Village Hall Committee were given and can be read in the minutes.

And finally a new Chair: I will be standing down as Chair at the next meeting in May 2025. If the village wishes to maintain a Parish

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Meeting and the potential benefits this brings, a new Chair is needed. If you want to find out more please give me a call.
